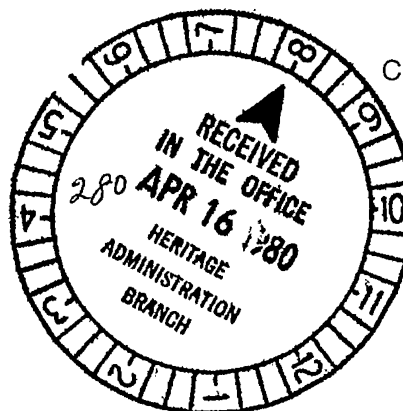

NOTICE OF PASSING OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener has passed By-law number 80-57-P to designate part of the following property as being of historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

The subject property is located at 787 King Street West, and is owned by the Waterloo County Board of Education. It is intended that only the area in the foyer of the Kitchener-Waterloo Collegiate and Vocational School between the two pillars upon which the school's Role of Honour listing the names of the war dead now stands, will be designated.

The reason for the designation described herein is attributed to the fact that the Kitchener-Waterloo Collegiate and Vocational School is a building of historical value in recognition of its 125 years of service to this community, its profound effect upon the lives of many of our distinguished citizens, and in recognition of the efforts of the men and women who dedicated their lives to the education of the students who attended this school.

WHEREAS section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises known municipally as 787 King Street West in the City of Kitchener and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to designate as historically valuable that part of the aforesaid real property being an area in the foyer off the King Street entrance as more particularly hereinafter described and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of historical value that part of the aforesaid real property known as the Kitchener-Waterloo Collegiate and Vocational School at 787 King Street West in the City of Kitchener, being comprised of that area in the foyer off the King Street entrance situated between the two pillars upon which the said school's Hall of Honour listing the names of the war dead now stands.
2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the whole of the property described in Schedule "A" hereto (of which the said designated area forms a part) in the proper land registry office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing

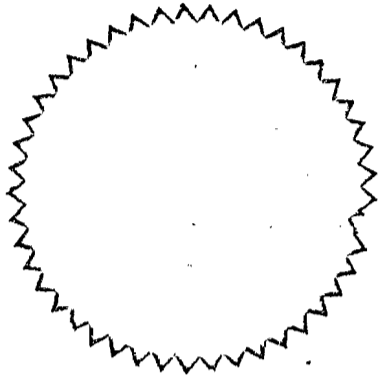
