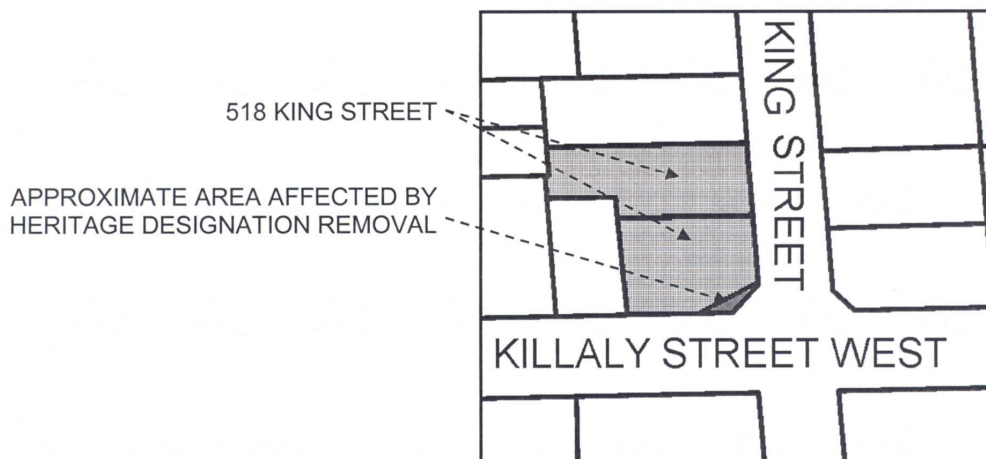
Heritage Designation Removal

TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Section 32(2) of the Ontario Heritage Act, notice is hereby provided that it is Council's intent to repeal in part By-law No. 1389/82/83, A By-Law Designating 518 King Street as Being of Architectural or Historical Value or Interest, at a Council Meeting held no earlier than October 28, 2013 at 6:30pm.

PROPOSED CHANGE

The purpose of the by-law is to remove the Part IV designation from 17.44m² (187.72 sq ft) of the property. The reason for the removal is to accommodate a need for the Regional Municipality of Niagara to increase the size of the intersection of King Street and Killaly Street West (Regional Road 5). The rest of the property is to remain designated under By-law No. 1389/82/83. No structures or features deemed to be of heritage value are located on the portion of property having heritage designation removed.

If no notice of objection is filed within the 30 day period, Council of the City of Port Colborne may approve the heritage designation removal.
