## By-Law Number 2023-158

A By-Law to Repeal By-Law Number 2007-167 (A By-Law To Designate 40 Sir John A. Macdonald Boulevard, also known as 'The Prison for Women (P4W)' To Be Of Cultural Heritage Value And Interest Pursuant To The Provisions Of The Ontario Heritage Act (R.S.O. 1990, 0.18))

Passed: August 8, 2023

Whereas pursuant to By-Law Number 2007-167 (A By-Law to Designate 40 Sir John A. Macdonald Boulevard, also known as 'The Prison for Women (P4W)' to be of Cultural Heritage Value Pursuant to the Provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, (R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18)), the subject property was designated as a property of cultural heritage value and interest in accordance with the provisions of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18 (the "Act"); and

Whereas Section 31 of the Act authorizes the Council of a municipality to repeal a by-law designating a property to be of cultural heritage value or interest; and

Whereas pursuant to City of Kingston File No. R01-013-2022, the subject property owners entered into a heritage easement agreement, pursuant to Section 37 of the Act, to conserve the cultural heritage value of the property; and

Whereas Council consulted with its Municipal Heritage Committee on the repeal of the designation by-law for the subject property on May 17, 2023; and

Whereas a notice of intention to repeal a designation by-law has been published in The Whig Standard, which is a newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality, and served on the property owner and the Ontario Heritage Trust on June 13, 2023; and

Whereas no notice of objection to the proposed repeal has been served on the Clerk of The Corporation of the City of Kingston.

Therefore be it resolved that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston hereby enacts as follows:

1. By-law 2007-167 is hereby deleted in its entirety and removed from the City of Kingston Heritage Register;

- 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the lands and on The Ontario Heritage Trust; and
- 3. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the date of its passing.
