



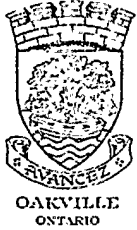

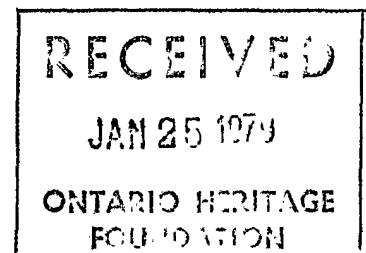
Thank you for your letter of January 15th, 1979,


Dear Sir:

It is my understanding that you will forward the necessary instructions to my office.

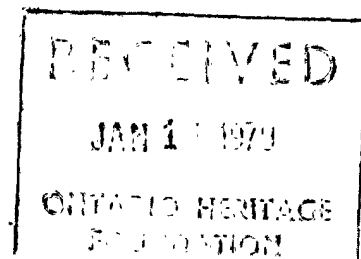

BY-LAW NUMBER 1979-3

A by-law to define an area to be examined for future designation as a heritage conservation district

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Pursuant to the advice of the Town's Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, the area lying between the Sixteen Mile Creek and Allan Street, and between Robinson Street and Lake Ontario is hereby defined as an area of the Town to be examined for future designation as a heritage conservation district pursuant to the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974.

PASSED by the Council this 2nd day of January, 1979.
