BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SCUGOG enacts as follows:



274 NORTH STREET, PORT PERRY

Description of Property

The property occupied by the one and a half storey brick residence at 274 North Street is located on the south side of North Street immediately west of the Ascension Anglican Church in the historic residential neighbourhood one block north of the historic commercial core of Queen Street.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The residence was constructed in 1905 as the Rectory for the neighbouring Anglican Church which began holding services in 1869. Today it still acts as the primary residence of the parish priest.

This home and a handful of others in the immediate area reflect the transition in architecture style that took place around the turn of the last century and combines elements of the picturesque Queen Anne style of the late 19th century with those of the early 20th century Arts and Crafts Bungalow style. The house at 274 North Street, along with neighbouring heritage homes and their well-maintained lawns, gardens and street trees contribute to the gracious historic residential character of the neighbourhood immediately north of the downtown core.

Description of Heritage Attributes

Key exterior and interior attributes that embody the heritage value of 274 North Street include its:

- L-shaped building footprint;
- combination of steep gabled and hipped roof forms with deep eaves;
- dark red machine made brick exterior walls and chimney;
- random coursed cut granite fieldstone foundation;
- patterned wooden shingle gable walls and wooden corbels;
- original window and door openings and window sills;
- front veranda with its low pitched roof and turned wooden porch columns.
