Relocation of House Within Site

At its meeting on September 8, 2014, Oakville Town Council approved the following resolution with respect to the subject item noted above:

- 1. That Heritage Permit Application HP043/14-42.20R for the relocation of the McDermott House at 87 Reynolds Street to a new lot, as attached in Appendix B to the report dated August 13, 2014, from Planning Services, be approved subject to the following conditions:
 - a. That the property owner enter into a heritage easement agreement with the Town prior to the relocation of the house in order to ensure the protection of the heritage building including appropriate setbacks as discussed at the Heritage Oakville meeting of August 26, 2014;
 - b. That the Town Solicitor be authorized to discharge the heritage easement agreement from title, at the expense of the owner, once the requirements in the agreement have been met to the satisfaction of the Senior Manager of Current Planning and Heritage; and
- 2. That this heritage permit expire two years from the date of final approval by Council.
