Take notice that the Council of
the Corporation of the Town of St
Marys intends to designate the
property, including lands and
buildings, known municipally as
James Street North at Queen as a
property of architectural value or
interest under Part IV of the
Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O
Chapter 122

**Reasons for the Proposed
Designation**

The Grand Trunk Railway Depot
was constructed in the summer of
1907 the third station on the line
in St Marys. It was built of a glazed
brick of brownish tint known as
Logan brick. The general
contractor, and possible designer,
was E Chandler of Stratford.
Originally the depot contained a
main waiting room (20' x 50') with a
ticket and operating room at the
rear, men's and women's toilets, a
ladies' retiring room, a smoking
room for men, a baggage room (16'
x 16 1/2'), at the south end, and an
express department located at the
north end. The building was of
individual design but according to
The Argus of July 25 1907 bore
similarities to the Fans depot.

Any person may, before the 21st
day of September 1987 send by
registered mail or deliver to the
Clerk of the Town of St Marys
notice of his or her objection to the
proposed designation together
with a statement of the reasons for
the objection and all relevant facts.
When a Notice of Objection has
been received the Council of the
Town of St Marys will refer the
matter to the Conservation Review
Board for a hearing and report.
