A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE 85 SYDENHAM STREET AS BEING OF ARCHITEC-TURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF <u>THE ONTARIO HERITAGE</u> ACT

PASSED: December 1, 1981

WHEREAS Section 29 of <u>The Ontario Heritage Act</u>, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS a notice of intention to designation 85 Sydenham Street was served on the owner on the 8th day of October, 1981 and was published in the Whig-Standard on the October 8th, 15th and 22nd, 1981;

AND WHEREAS no notices of objection to the proposed designation have been served on the Clerk of the City of Kingston;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as 85 Sydenham Street, in the City of Kingston, as more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law and the reasons for designation to be registered against the land described in Schedule "A" hereto in the Registry Office at Kingston, Ontario.

3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the land described in

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Schedule "A" hereto and on The Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the Whig-Standard once for each of three consecutive weeks.

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4. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on its passing.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a by-law be presented to Council pursuant to the provisions of The Ontario Heritage Act, to designate 85 Sydenham Street to be of architectural and historic value or interest for the following reasons:

85 Sydenham Street - Southerly Half of Town Lot Number Nine on Sydenham Street, as Shown on Plan B-27, in the City of Kingston, County of Frontenac.
