Together, they make up a rare historical complex of farm buildings, typical of the industrious pioneers who came to Mono in the mid 1800's. The main house was built c1855 and is in fair condition. Its balanced symmetry and central peak are representative of the Gothic farmhouse style. It is one of the few remaining stone buildings in the Town of Mono of this type and style. It is a landmark perched high above the 6th Line EHS (Airport Rd), which has contributed to the character of the road for well over a century. This property is well known in the community as the original homestead of the Anderson family, having been in their possession from 1850 to 2009. This pleasing complex of historically significant buildings continues to contribute to the understanding of rural pioneer life in Mono.
