

Notice of Intention to Designate



IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT AND IN THE MATTER OF the lands in the Town of Halton Hills known municipally as 50 Queen Street, Georgetown, legally described as "LT 18, PL 37; PT LT 17, PL 37, SE OF QUEEN ST, AS IN 594253, S/T 594253 HALTON HILLS", Regional Municipality of Halton, and known as the Bailey-Thompson House.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Halton Hills intends to designate the property at 50 Queen Street, Georgetown under Section 29(1), Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest:

The property at 50 Queen Street has historical and associative value due to its builder Thomas Bailey and its long-time ownership by the Thompson family. Carpenter Thomas Bailey built the home shortly after purchasing the property, and in addition to being part of the Methodist Church in Georgetown Bailey rented several houses on Queen Street before relocating to Toronto.
