Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 17th and 19th days of September, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 2-14 Richmond Street East, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122. The reason for the proposed designation is that the property is a fine example of the progressive and modernized Gothic style, practised at the end of the nineteenth century, here adapted to the design of a very large building which was once the tallest in the City and still dominates the streetscape in its immediate area.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of September 26th 1975.
