Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 1st day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 15 Shuter Street, as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.


Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Massey Music Hall, 15 Shuter Street at 178 Victoria Street, by G. M. Miller.

The Massey Music Hall is recommended for designation on architectural grounds as a fine example of a late nineteenth century concert hall. The Moorish-styled interior is an especially fine example of the style and of the decorative work of an important Toronto architect. The building also has undoubted historical associations with the musical and cultural life of the City while providing a point of architectural interest and a change in scale in the streetscape east of Yonge Street.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of October 10th, 1975.
