## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 15th day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 71-75 Richmond Street West, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

## Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Graphic Arts Building, 71-75 Richmond Street West at Sheppard Street (SE), 1913, by F. S. Baker. The Graphic Arts Building is recommended for designation on architectural grounds as a fine example of Beaux Arts classical design which successfully adapts the columned temple form to use as an office building. The building is also important in terms of the surrounding streetscape for the way in which it anchors the corner and integrates (by the use of similar facade detailing) the line of Sheppard Street with that of Richmond Street.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of January 16th, 1976. (Reference File 0855).
