
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 5th and 7th days of December, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.74 Winchester Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

74 Winchester Street (St. Enoch's Church) was built in 1891. It is a landmark in the Don Vale Community. The corner entrance tower surmounted by a steeply pitched terra cotta tile roof and decorative iron weather-vane is a distinctive feature of this finely detailed Romanesque Revival design. The attractive brickwork and stone trim of the exterior accentuates the fine stained glass windows. Designation is proposed for architectural reasons.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 21st day of December, 1977. (File 1407).
