NOTICE OF PASSING OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener has passed By-law #91-326 and #91-376 to designate properties at 35 Gordon Avenue and 30 Courtland Avenue E. as being of historic and architectural value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

NOTICE OF INTENTION

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener intends to designate the following municipal address as being of historic and architectural significance under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

115 Woodside Avenue (Woodside Pool)

Woodside Municipal Swimming Pool was constructed in 1931 in the Neo-Classical style and was the first public swimming pool built in Kitchener.

The proposed designation includes all elevations. Specific features of interest include: flat roof with concrete parapet; all 14 and 16 light windows with metal muntins, brick voussoirs and concrete sills; round arch entry with brick voussoirs and concrete archivolt; concrete urns; concrete inserts with fish and lyre motif; concrete lintel with "SWIMMING POOL" inscription; polychromatic brickwork.

Any person may, before the 17th day of February, 1992, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Kitchener notice of his or her objections to the proposed designations, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a Hearing and report.
