THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF KINGSVILLE

BY-LAW 83 - 2005

Being a by-law to designate a certain property, known as the Negro Cemetery, as being of cultural heritage value or interest under the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.O.18 as amended

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures located thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council for The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville has consulted with the Kingsville Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee with respect to the designation of the Negro Cemetery as being of cultural heritage value or interest;

AND WHEREAS authority was granted by Council to designate such property;

AND WHEREAS the Council for The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands known as the Negro Cemetery and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to designate the property and has caused the Notice of Intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality as required by the Ontario Heritage Act;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "A" to this By-law;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk for The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville.

NOW THEREFORE the Council for The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville enacts as follows:

That the property known as the Negro Cemetery, more particularly described in 1. Schedule "B" and shown on Schedule "C" attached to this by-law is hereby designated as being of cultural heritage value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.O.18, as amended.

That the municipality's solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-2. law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "B" to this by-

law in the proper Land Registry Office;

That the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville is hereby 3. authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville as required by the Ontario

That Schedules "A", "B" and "C" form an integral part of this by-law. 4.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD time and FINALLY PASSED this 12th day of September, 2005.

Schedule "A" to By-law 83-2005 of The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville

Reasons for Designation

Negro Cemetery Division Road North, Town of Kingsville

The property described as Part of Lot L, Concession 3, Town of Kingsville, being a physical remnant of the early Black community, is the only known African-Canadian Cemetery in the Town of Kingsville. Typical of Ontario farm pioneer burial grounds, the Negro Cemetery is associated with the defunct Shiloh Baptist Church on Concession 3 West of Division Road North. This cemetery has historical significance internationally in that it was associated with the underground railroad that brought fugitive slaves from the southern United States to freedom in Canada.

Among the Black pioneers interred here is George Ryers, who died in 1901 at age 80. He came to Canada from the Southern United States slave states. His son, Joseph, who died in 1924 is also buried here. Other Black pioneers, including members of the Williams, Henderson, Lyons, Dennis and Chapman families, are also buried here.

In 1837, the land was purchased by John W. Williams, the first Black landowner in Gosfield, as the area now encompassed by the Town of Kingsville was known. Williams purchased the property in 1837 from Reverend Richard Herrington, a preacher who founded the Baptist faith in the local area.

Abutting landowners have always been careful not to work the land, but oral history has it that pigs from a neighbouring farm got loose one day and toppled the headstones that once marked the graves.


The heritage attributes of the property consist of:

The 35-foot x 59-foot cemetery site nestled between tracts of farmland has fieldstone placed around its perimeter to delineate it from surrounding lands. The cemetery site, the headstones belonging to the cemetery and the remains of those headstones located thereon, the newly-placed granite monument marker identifying the known burials, the existing wood fence posts and/or holes of removed fence posts, and the fieldstone, all should remain protected and undisturbed in their current location, disinterments should be strictly prohibited, and the maintenance of the grounds should serve to forever document the historical significance of this important site. The laneway making the cemetery accessible from Division Road North was restored in June 2005.


