NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Town of Orangeville intends to designate the site located at the south west corner of Mill and Little York Streets; Part of Lot 23 and Part of Lot 25, Block 6, Plan 138, more particularly described as Parts 1, 2, 3 and Part 4, Reference Plan 7R-2482, municipally known as 20 Church Street (Mill Park), in the Town of Orangeville, in the County of Dufferin, in the Province of Ontario.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The site known now as Mill Park has been a focal point of the community since 1856. The ruins of the Jull Mill (sometimes known as the Orange Lawrence Mill) and the natural attributes of Mill Creek lend themselves to development of a significant downtown resource and an important link in the Orangeville Trail system. The site is proposed for designation because of its historical significance.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk no later than 4:30 p.m. on February 19, 2001.
