THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE BY-LAW 1988-160

A by-law to designate a certain property as a property of historical and architectural value and interest (29-31 Bronte Road).

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The property municipally known as 29-31 Bronte Road is hereby designated as a property of historical and architectural value and interest pursuant to the Ontario Heritage Act for the reasons set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- 2. The property designated by this by-law is the property described in Schedule "B" attached to this by-law.

SCHEDULE "A"

To By-Law 1988-160

Reasons for Designation

The building at 29-31 Bronte Road is an integral part of a block which contains several heritage buildings.

Architecturally, the building is a good example of the homes built in the Bronte Area during the late 1800's exhibiting such features as: decorative vergeboard, corner boards, entablatures, decorative frieze, detailed eaves (returned eaves), recessed porch and plain doorway. The building is constructed of shiplap.

Historically, the building is believed to have been built by Dalt McDonald, a long-time resident of Bronte who held various occupations including boatbuilder, fisherman and carpenter. In 1910, the south portion of 29-31 Bronte Road was the Clemence Grocery Store. The Sargant family has lived in the house for over 40 years. The parents of the present owners were actively involved in the community. Furthermore, it is believed that the northernly portion of the building served as a bank.
