BY-LAW NO. 1517-83

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE STRUCTURE KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 401 CENTRE STREET SOUTH AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE AND INTEREST

WHEREAS Section 29 of the $\underline{\text{Ontario Heritage Act}}$, 1980, R.S.O., c. 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to designate property, as defined therein, to be of architectural and historical value and interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whiby has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as 401 Centre Street South, Whitby, Ontario, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to designate the structure at the aforesaid address and has caused such notice to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality in accordance with the provisions of said Act;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby enacts as follows:

- 1. That the exterior of the property known as The McKay House at 401 Centre Street South, Whitby, Ontario, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto attached, be and the same is hereby designated as being of architectural and historical value and interest in accordance with the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, R.S.O., c. 337. This designation shall not preclude any changes that may be deemed necessary for the efficient use of the building provided that any and all changes shall be in keeping with the original and present character of the building and are carried out in consultation with the Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee for the Town of Whitby.
- 2. That the municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law, together with the reasons for designation, to be registered against the aforesaid property in the proper land registry office.

That the Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Whitby, in the Regional Municipality of Durham and being composed of part of Lots numbered Nine (9) and Ten (10) in the First Tier of the Fourth Double Range of lots west of Brock Street as shown on Plan H-50032, formerly Werden's Plan West of Brock Street, more particularly described as follows:

TAKE NOTICE that Council of the Corporation of the TOWN of WHITBY has passed By-law 1517-83 to designate the following property as being of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337:

The McKay House 401 Centre Street South Whitby, Ontario

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION MCKAY HOUSE

(a) Architectural

This red brick with yellow brick trim house displays many decorative elements of Gothic Revival origin including the intricate bargeboards and the wood trim of the verandahs. The windows are of particular interest featuring arches, voussoirs and finials of yellow brick and louvered wooden shutters and bigsills supported by corbels of yellow brick. A second storey window displays a decorative window box while the first storey, stain-glassed window features a pseudo balcony.

(b) Historical

The house was built by William Dunkley a local contractor, as his private home in 1874. The house was also the home of Donald McKay, Ontario County Treasurer from 1890 to 1914 and his daughter Emily McKay who succeeded him as Treasurer of Ontario County from 1914 until her retirement in 1947.
