The William Mitchell House, 18 King Street

The William Mitchell House is a one and a half storey residential building located on the west side of King Street in Port Hope's historic neighborhood of Protestant Hill.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The William Mitchell House is a one and half storey residential building completed circa 1834 by Irish carpenter/builder William Mitchell. The built and cultural heritage value of this early nineteenth century dwelling is evident in its fine craftsmanship and key exterior/interior attributes. It is a well preserved early example of a local Saltbox showcasing the unique talents of the builder, with some distinctive modifications made during later alterations. Additionally, the house has been the home of Canadian authors Farley and Claire Mowat for many years.
