TOWNSHIP OF WELLESLEY NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wellesley intends to designate the hereinafter mentioned property to be of historic and architectural significance under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act. R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

THE subject property is municipally known as 19 Doering Street, West, Wellesley and is owned by

THE house, originally built in 1867, has retained most of its original form, other than for the addition to the east rear portion. Historically, its builder, John G. Reiner was prominent, known as the "Builder of Wellesley", and has been inducted into the Waterloo County Hall of Fame. Various combinations of architectural influences from the Georgian, Classical and Victorian periods can be found throughout the house and for these reasons the decision to designate this house was reached.

NOTICE of objection to this designation may be served on the Clerk of the Township of Wellesley within 30 days of this Notice. Any Notice of Objection shall indicate the reasons for the Objection and all relevant facts.
