THE TOWN OF VAUGHAN BY-LAW

BY-LAW NUMBER 306-88

A By-law to designate the Thornhill Heritage Conservation District under the Ontario Heritage Act.

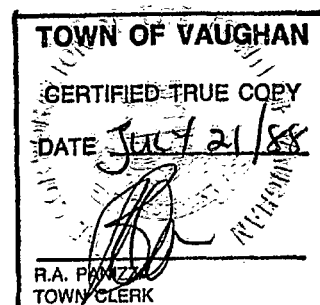
WHEREAS Section 41 the Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate the municipality or any defined area or areas thereof as a Heritage Conservation District; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of Town of Vaughan did by by-law define an area to be examined for future designation as a Heritage Conservation District under Section 40(1) of the said Act; and,

WHEREAS there is in effect an official plan that contains provisions relating to the establishment of heritage conservation districts;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Vaughan ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. That the area located within the Town of Vaughan, Regional Municipality of York and shown as "Heritage Conservation District Area" on Schedule "1" attached hereto, be designated the Thornhill Heritage Conservation District.
2. That the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make application to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval of this By-law within fourteen days from the date it is passed by Council.




3. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice to be served on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and in such manner and to such persons as the Ontario Municipal Board may direct of Council's application to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval of this By-law.

4. That this By-law shall NOT come into effect until approved by the Ontario Municipal Board.

READ a FIRST and SECOND time this 13th day July, 1988.

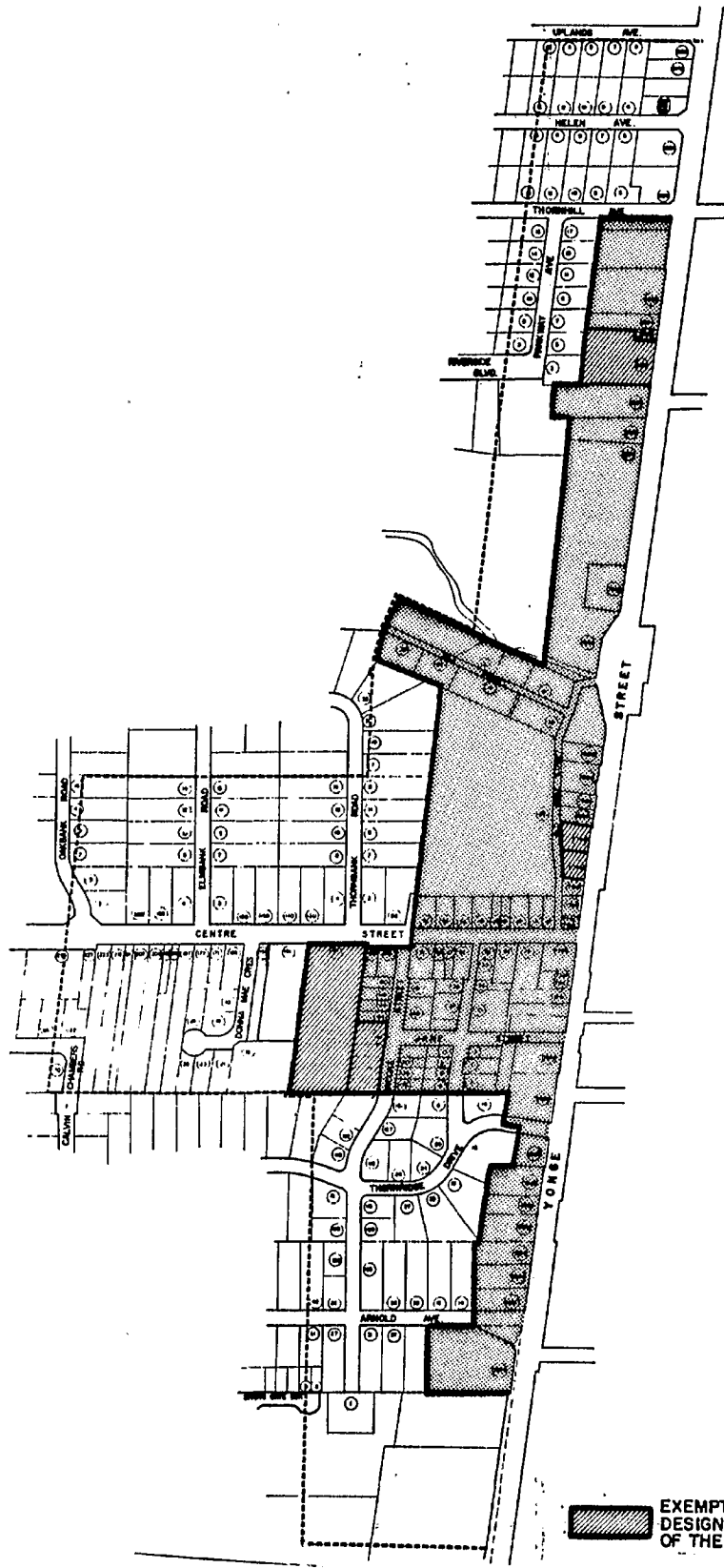


LEGEND

On the recommendation of the undersigned, the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and concurrence of the Executive Council, orders that

WHEREAS the Ontario Municipal Board by a decision dated May 4, 1989 approved an application by the Corporation of the Town of Vaughan for an order approving By-law 306-88 which designated an area known as The Thornhill Heritage Conservation District as a Heritage Conservation District;

AND WHEREAS British Capital Corporation has filed a petition asking that the Board's decision be varied to delete from The Thornhill Heritage Conservation District that portion of it south of Thornridge Drive or, in the alternative, that there should be a new public hearing to reconsider whether that part of the application relating to the area south of Thornridge Drive was properly included in a heritage conservation district based on a demonstrated need to protect an area of architectural and/or historical value from developmental change.

The decision of the Board dated May 4, 1989 is confirmed.
