NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE A BUILDING OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE OR INTEREST

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Aurora intends to designate the following property as a property of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest pursuant to the provisions of Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, as amended. A brief statement of reasons is included.

Description of Property

The property known municipally as 15229 Yonge Street designed as *Italianate* commercial architecture contains a 2 storey commercial building located in the heart of Aurora's historic downtown on the east side Yonge Street.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

Sited on the former location of the Stevenson Block, the Willis Building was erected in 1905 for William C. Willis, a harness maker. After Willis went out of business in 1911, the building accommodated a number of other retail services including another harness-maker, a merchant and a tailor. For almost ninety years, this building has housed restaurants, beginning in 1929 with Dan's Café, Aurora's first Chinese restaurant, which may well have also been Aurora's first free-standing restaurant.

Description of Heritage Attributes

Important to the preservation of the property are the original key attributes that express its value, which include:

Exterior Elements

- flat roof;
- · elaborate metal cornice with four brackets;
- decorative brick work including four corbels and an architrave;
- brick voussoir;
- fenestration on the front elevation features three windows on the second storey.

If a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Town of Aurora will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and a report.
