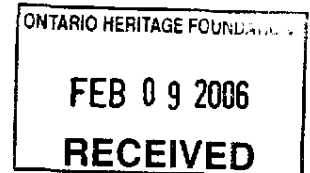

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE A HERITAGE CONSERVATION DISTRICT

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the City of Windsor intends to designate 32 properties on the 200 block of Prado Place (including 5525 and 5485 Riverside Drive East) as a "Heritage Conservation District" under Part V of the Ontario Heritage Act for the following reasons:

The 200 block of Prado Place is a unique cultural landscape because of its 50-ft right of way, narrow pavement width, mid-block landscaped island, ten original Town of Riverside street lamps (the only such lamps remaining as installed, c1923), an eclectic mix of fine homes, landscaped fore-gardens and overhanging shade trees. The intent of the district designation is to preserve the streetscape.

Any person may, within thirty days of the publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Windsor notice of his/her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. The fee prescribed under the *Ontario Municipal Board Act 2002*, c.18, Sched. F,d.2 (25) must also accompany the appeal. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Windsor shall refer the matter to the Ontario Municipal Board.
