A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE LITTLE RED BANK AS A BUILDING OF HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Petrolia deems it advisable to designate the Little Red Bank as a building of historic significance.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of Petrolia hereby enacts as follows:

1. That, in recognition of the Little Red Bank's importance as a local landmark, which was moved to its present location on August 12, 1869, and due to its role as the first oil exchange in the world and one of the last, and longest operating, private banks in Canada, the property, including buildings and lands, within the Town of Petrolia described as 4245 Petrolia Street South, Plan 9 Part Lot 2, Plan 38, Block F Part Lot A, is hereby proclaimed to be designated under the provisions of Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act and Amendments thereto.
2. And, that, in order to ensure the integrity of the Little Red Bank as a building of historic significance, alterations on any part of the exterior that substantially alter the existing character, shape, or exterior dimensions of the building are prohibited without the consent of Council.

BY-LAW read a first and second time and provisionally passed this 14th day of June, 1976.


