**NOTICE OF INTENTION TO REPEAL THE
DESIGNATING BY-LAW 2010-90
PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 31 OF

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Niagara Falls intends to repeal the designating by-law on land and building known as:

7565 Lundy's Lane, Former Parks, Recreation & Culture Building

The property is located on the north side of Lundy's Lane, at the intersection with Montrose Road and described as: Part 1, on Reference Plan 59R-14083, City of Niagara Falls, Regional Municipality of Niagara.

EXPLANATION OF THE REPEAL

The building originally constructed as the School at Green's Corner was last occupied by the Niagara Falls Parks Recreation & Culture Department. Over the past 14 years there has been substantial deterioration of the interior and portions of the exterior of the building. To date, plans to occupy and/or sell the building have not come to fruition. The condition of the building has continued to worsen, increasing the costs for renovation/retrofit and presenting a potential safety hazard to the public. As such, Council intends to repeal By-law No. 2010-90 in order to proceed with the proposed demolition of the building and the re-development of the lands for cemetery and beautification purposes.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION

Notice of an objection to the repealing of the designating by-law must be served on the City Clerk within 30 days after the date of this notice. The deadline for objection is AUGUST 26, 2019 at 4:30 pm. The Notice of Objection must set out the reason(s) for objection and all relevant facts.
