
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 25th and 27th days of July, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.44 Wolseley Street/16 Ryerson Avenue, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Built as a bakery in 1902 with stable space for delivery wagon horses, it is a notable example of a small industrial building of the period. The skilful use of brick and classical architectural design elements in the facade gives it a prominence in the neighbourhood that is usually found only in public buildings.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 12th day of August, 1977. (File 1357).
