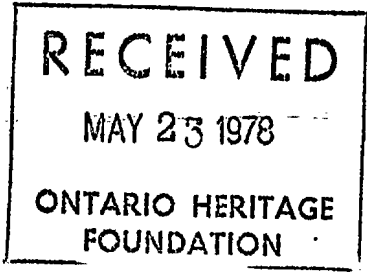

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 24th day of April, 1978, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.149 College Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

149 College Street, The Toronto Athletic Club (later the Stewart Building). This building is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Designed by E.J. Lennox and built in 1892-94, it is a significant work in the Romanesque Revival style, by this important Toronto architect. In 1900, the lavish interior of the building was altered by A.F. Wickson, architect, to house the first Technical School for the Toronto Board of Education. In 1930, it was again remodelled for civic offices by J.J. Woolnough, architect. Large arched windows, prominent wall dormers, a fine arched entrance portico and a distinctive use of stone and brick are noteworthy features retained in each alteration.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 5th day of May, 1978. (File 1458).
