BY-LAW NUMBER 1987-25

A by-law to designate certain property as property of historic and architectural value and interest (47 Bronte Road)

THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The property known municipally as 47 Bronte Road is hereby designated as a property of historic and architectural value and interest persuant to the Ontario Heritage Act, for the reason set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- 2. The property designated by this by-law is the property described in Schedule "B" attached to this by-law.

REASON FOR DESIGNATION:

Architectural

This building is a vernacular rendition of Victorian Gothic Style which has been only slightly altered.

The building was constructed in 1870.

Historical

It is believed that the original use of the building was for a Post Office and that the building was the first to be built as a Post Office for Bronte.
