### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PERTH

#### BY-LAW 2785

A By-Law to designate certain properties within the Municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest

WHEREAS chapter 337 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980 provides that the Council of a Municipality may, by by-law, designate properties within the Municipality to be of historical or architectural value or interest.

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to designate certain properties within the Municipality was served on the owner of the properties and the Ontario Heritage Foundation, July 15, 1988 and was published in the Perth Courier July 20, July 27 and August 3, 1988.

AND WHEREAS no objections were received against the designation of the said properties as a result of the aforementioned notices:

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Perth ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The following properties be and are hereby designated to be of historic or architectural value or interest:

Description: St. James Anglican Church Drummond Street East., St. James
Rectory and stone wall Harvey Street located on Part of Lots
5 & 6 on the south side of Harvey Street, Town of Perth, Plan
8828 designated as Part 1, Plan 27R2317.

Owner: St. James Anglican Church

Reason For Designation:

## St. James Church

Constitucted during the years 1856-1861, this building is a classic example of the Gothic Revival style of architecture complete with point window arches, trefoils, buttressess and molded label surrounds. The tower and spire were constructed in 1888 completing the Cathedral impression.

### Rector

Constructed in 1875 of local yellow brick and stone, it is 3 1/2 stories high which includes the basement level only viewable from the sides and rear. The remaining 2 1/2 stories is of yellow brick construction in the Gothic Revival Style, complete with molded label surrounds, finals, very decorative barge board and verandah trelliage. There are also 2 rows of brick corbelling betwirt the first and second floors. A one storey verandah runs the entire length of the facade.

### Stone Wall

This retaining wall was constructed of the same stone used in the Church and part of the Rectory. This wall is an important feature in the streetscape. It could be said that the wall is the link which holds the St. James Church and Rectory together.
