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THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CLARENCE-ROCKLAND

BY-LAW NO. 2006-116

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 2184 LAURIER STREET, AS BEING OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE OR INTEREST;

WHEREAS section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act authorizes the Council of the municipality, by by-law, to designate a property within the municipality to be of cultural heritage value or interest;

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Clarence-Rockland has caused to serve to the owner of the property and to the Ontario Heritage Trust a notice of intention to designate the aforesaid property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served to the Clerk of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Clarence-Rockland enacts as follows:


- Section 1: The property located on the North side of Laurier Street and on the East side of St-Jean Street, described as being Parts of Lots 17 and 18 of Bell Plan 1908, in Rockland, identified in black on Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this by-law, shall be the property affected by this by-law.
- Section 2: The Legal Description, the Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest and the Description of Heritage Attributes are stated on Schedule "B" attached hereto and are fully integrated as part of this by-law.
- Section 3: The City's legal advisor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property in the proper Land Registry Office.
- Section 4: The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law, together with a statement explaining the cultural heritage value or interest of the property and a description of the heritage attributes of the property, to be served to the owner of the aforesaid property and to the Ontario Heritage Trust and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.

Section 5: This by-law shall become effective on the date of passing.

SCHEDULE "B"

Description of Property - Très-Sainte-Trinité Church, 2184 Laurier Street

The Très-Sainte-Trinité Church is located on the North side of Laurier Street and on the East side of St-Jean Street.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The church provides us with typical roman style architecture. It is located in a prime location in downtown Rockland. The exterior walls are also made of grey stones from the Rockland's quarry. The bell-tower is home for 5 bells (do, fa, sol, la, do) that were casted from the Paccard foundries located in Annecy-Le-Vieux in Haute Savoie, France.

In 1917, the community, with the guidance of priest Hudon, began the task of rebuilding the church. The church is home to a Casavant organ with extraordinary acoustics. The church is an ideal location for music concerts.

The interior decor of the buildings was commissioned to well reputed artisans such as T.-X. Renaud and Georges Delfosse, artists and decorators; Carli – Petrucci, sculptors; Joseph Villeneuve, woodworker, and Hamon & Hess, marbles and tiles. The building and its contents are considered religious heritage gems for the municipality.

Description of Heritage Attributes

Key attributes of the church that reflect its value as an important link to the history of the City of Clarence-Rockland include:

- The exterior walls made of grey stones from the Rockland's quarry;
- The church tower;
- Its location and dimensions.

Key attributes of the church that reflect its value as preservation of its interior design include:

- Wooden sculptures;
- Many pieces of furniture;
- Central altar in the chancel;
- Side altars;
- Confessionals;
- Organs;
- Pulpit;
- Communion table;
- Tables and console tables;
- Crucifix and ornaments;
- Statues;
- Way of the cross;
- Baptism fonts;
- Stained glass windows.
