REASONS FOR DESIGNATION OF 1508 ROSSLAND ROAD EAST

Historical

This farm house was built by William Anderson in 1834 on land owned by the University of Toronto. William Flint bought the house in 1855. Anderson Street in Whitby was named after William Anderson.

Architectural

The house was designed in the Neo Classical/Regency style and is noteworthy for the fact that 3 sides are of rubblestone construction while the front facade is made of brick. It is the oldest masonry house, and one of the oldest structures of any kind, still standing in the Town.

Any person may, before November 16, 1984, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Whitby notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such notice of objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
